12. **Ad Astra, Sat 24 Sep 2022**

On behalf of Susan Scarborough, the Chair of the Board of Directors, 608 Sqn is invited to the National Air Force Museum of Canada’s 27th annual Ad Astra Ceremony.

The Cadet Squadron banners are welcome to parade with the Colour party of the Air Force Associations and Legion Branches that are participating.

We would also like to ask if each Squadron could provide 3 Cadets in uniform to assist with ushering VIP guests to their seats. As well, in speaking to some of the Associations, they may be short members of their respective Colour Parties. This would be a wonderful opportunity for your Cadets to assist them if you have bodies available. We do not know how many they will need, but if you are willing to stand by and assist, it would be appreciated.

The ceremony will be held on Saturday the 24th of September, 2022 at 14:00 hrs in the RCAF Memorial Air Park. Every year this event attracts crowds from across the country to witness the dedication and benediction of both new and established Ad Astra Stones. This year 100 new stones will be dedicated, bringing the total number of stones in place along the pathways of the airpark to over 12,000.

The 2022 theme is “Joint Task Force (Afghanistan) Air Wing” to coincide with the arrival of “The Wounded”, a traveling exhibit developed by the Canadian War Museum, in partnership with Legion Magazine, which features portraits of 18 Canadian veterans of the war in Afghanistan by photojournalist Stephen J. Thorne.

The program also includes the 8 Wing Pipes and Drums Band, Trenton Citizen’s Band, a colour party composed of Air Force Association Wings, Cadet Squadrons and a flypast (weather permitting).

Dress for military members is DEU 1A and medals.

Dress for cadets will be C1A – Ceremonial Dress. Sign-up sheets will be available prior to start of activity.

PART J – SQUADRON SPONSORING COMMITTEE

46. Occasional Community Supporters, Volunteer Drivers, Guest Lecturers

Basic Screening to be completed for any adult who supports the Cadet Program on an occasional basis and (who) will not be under the constant supervision of a fully screened adult. This may apply to committee members, occasional community supporters, occasional drivers, League members and guest lecturers. It may apply to CAF Reg F and P Res members, DND employees and civilian contractors in accordance with their type of engagement.

Basic Level screening requires submission of the application, an initial interview, and a favourable VSS (reference checks and a final interview are optional).

Once all the screening elements are complete and submitted by mail, 1-3 weeks should be allowed for delivery and processing at RCSU HQ.

Basic Screening is not required for guest instructors or visitors who will be escorted / supervised at all times, nor is it required for parents of cadets, screened League members, or others who are present at the training site but do not have any unsupervised direct interaction with cadets. Screening is required for drivers supporting fundraising efforts such as tag day (except for a parent driving only their own child), and for any other adult who will have direct interaction with cadets that is not under the supervision of a CJCR screened adult.

This event will feature a parade with a contingent of cadets from all three elements as well as a band and flag party. The Hon. Elizabeth Dowdeswell, Lieutenant Governor of Ontario will be the Reviewing Officer for this auspicious event.

As well as the celebratory parade in Toronto, individual units are encouraged to take the opportunity to celebrate the Cadet Program in your local areas. We hope that each of you plan and execute local events in the first week of October that showcases your cadets, your officers, staff and volunteers. In addition, it is a perfect opportunity to

collaborate with other units within your communities to enhance the recognition of our amazing youth organization. Some suggestions as to what might be possible include local municipal recognition, flag raisings and proclamations, parades, displays in malls or other public areas. We are hopeful that one day of Ontario Cadet Week will be community service driven such as area clean ups or beautification projects.

All cadets will be required to complete an interview with the Commanding Officer (or delegated individual).

52. Mask Policy/Posture for Staff and Cadets

The mask policy is driven by the CDS down to the various commanders. WRT places like Trenton, Kingston, Petawawa the CDS has delegate auth to next level commanders WRT masking. Trenton relaxed mask posture several weeks back, followed by Kingston. Petawawa relaxed the posture approx 10 days ago.

Mask policy for CIC/COATS/JCR is with Comd CJCR, BGen Speiser-Blanchet. She has not delegated auth down further. Current posture is that all CIC/COATS mbrs are required to wear masks indoors; cadets to follow local public health guidelines (which typically are that masks are optional). This is what I have been sending out:

While the mask posture has changed or relaxed in some instances (WRT CAF) the posture for our operations and activities remains unchanged at this time. Specifically,

Wearing of masks:

- a. CAF regs (CIC / COATS, CIs, Reg F and P Res pers) will remain subj to CDS direction (masks to be worn in all common and public areas),
- b. Cadets and volunteers will follow the requirements established by the facility or the applicable provincial / territorial health regs,
- c. Cadets will not therefore not require masks outdoors, and indoors only at CERTAIN DND / Federal facilities (including DND veh, aircraft and vessels) or as otherwise required by a facility owner / operator,

While the CDS has delegated auth to modify mask posture to base/wing commanders (eg. 8 Wing Trenton is now relaxed, masks optional; 4 Div CDSG Petawawa is now relaxed, masks optional) the authority has not been delegated down WRT CIC/COATS/CJCR (BGen Speiser-Blanchet is that authority for us). For Cadets masks are optional at LHQ; at DND Facilities that will depend on the facility (Kingston for example). Best to check - you won't go wrong if masks are worn. For CIC/Coats pers masks to be worn in all common and public areas.

Again - for CIC/COATS staff (including CIs) - masks are NOT optional they are required at when indoors in all common and public areas. Classrooms, Parade Square/Drill Hall, pretty much anyplace where mbrs and cadets could or would gather. Posture for cadets is to follow local PHM.

53. Dress Instructions
