Retired after long service, Lieutenant (Navy) Allan Miller, CD2 of Trenton has reached that long service milestone not thought of when he enrolled in the Militia back in 1965. He was first an army cadet, then with The Essex and Kent Scottish (E&K Scots) in Chatham, ON and later the Royal Regiment of Canada in Toronto as an infantry soldier. While in Alberta as a church pastor he became a Sea Cadet officer. Moving back to Ontario he transferred to Air Cadets. He served as the chaplain to the 23 (Hamilton) Service Battalion and The Elgin Regiment (Royal Canadian Armoured Corps) before returning as an Army Cadet Instructor and more recently as Commanding Officer of 79 "Trent" Royal Canadian Sea Cadet Corps. His last service has been with 608 "Duke of Edinburgh" Royal Canadian Air Cadet Squadron in Belleville, Ontario. Many soldiers and cadets fondly remember him as the "Padre."
