WARNING ORDER RCSU CENTRAL VIRTUAL MUSIC TRAINING PROGRAM SPRING 2021

References: A. TY2021-22 RCSU Central Resumption of Training Plan; and B. CRCI 4503

SITUATION

- 1. The aim of the Central Region music program is to support the development of cadet bands by providing cadets the opportunity to develop as musicians.
- 2. IAW directives at refs, this year the training will be modified from our traditional format to conduct the training safely within a COVID-19 environment.

MISSION

- 3. Regional Cadet Support Unit Central (RCSU Central) will conduct a virtual music program between 01 October and 19 December 2021. The virtual music program will be designed to allow cadets flexibility to engage with the program to the extent that their circumstances and availability permit.
- 4. The program will consist of four components that will be conducted concurrently: asynchronous (self-lead content), group lessons, instrument lessons and music proficiency level evaluation. The details of these components are described in Annex A to this warning order.

ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTIONS

- 5. <u>Group Lessons:</u> Cadet musicians must be registered in FORTRESS for the specific group lesson, technical training activity serial that they wish to attend. Please note that repeated serials (for example, MilTheory Basic A and MilTheory Basic B) will cover the same content but will be conducted on different dates.
- 6. The table below lists the theory courses, dates, times, and FORTRESS serial for registration. The table also has suggested music level ranges for each course to help staff and cadets determine the appropriate serial to select.

- 7. Each group lesson serial will have a registration deadline that is 7 days prior to the serial date.
- 8. <u>Instrument Lessons</u>: Cadet Musicians who want to participate in private/semi-private lessons must be registered in FORTRESS for one of the following technical training serials:
 - a. <u>MilMusicLesson:</u> for all military band instruments including wood wind, brass, and percussion; or
 - b. **PipeBandLessons**: for all cadet bagpipers and pipe band drummers.
- 9. When registering cadets for these serials, an accurate instrument must be entered.
- 10. There are a limited number of openings for instrument lessons. The deadline to register will be 8 Nov 2021.
- 11. <u>Music Proficiency Level Evaluation</u>: Two options are available for cadet musicians who would like to be evaluated for a music proficiency level:

Option #1

a. Any adult who has appropriate music experience and ability on the instrument, and up to the level in question, can conduct the evaluation, virtually. This could be, for example, a cadet's band officer/instructor, school, or private music teacher.

- b. When an evaluation has been completed, the evaluator or unit staff member is to forward all assessment forms to Capt R. Lawrence (ryan.lawrence@forces.gc.ca). The assessment forms will be reviewed for completeness and the qualification granted accordingly.
- c. This option is available at any time during the training year.

Option #2

- d. Cadets can be registered for the "Instrument Lesson" serials (MilMusicLesson or PipeBandLessons), described in para 8 above as appropriate. Once assigned to an instructor, a cadet can identify their desire to be evaluated for a music level.
- e. The instructor will work with the cadet to schedule and complete the music level evaluation.
- 12. The group and instrument lessons will be conducted on WebEx. Access to WebEx will be delivered by email(s) directly to participating cadets with a link(s) to the appropriate online sessions. Please ensure that registered cadet's emails contacts are accurate in FORTRESS.
- 13. <u>Support Cadets</u> are invited to register for either the group or instrument lesson serials. Support cadets will assist with instruction, coaching and supervision as required by the instructor.
- 14. Support Cadets are also encouraged to participate in instruction sessions for their own musical development.
- 15. The selection criteria for Support Cadets will be as follows:
 - a. Minimum music proficiency level 3 qualification. Cadets with higher music proficiency level qualifications will be given priority.
 - b. Cadet with previous CTC/VCTC staff/support cadet experience on a music training course will be given priority.

SERVICE SUPPORT

- 16. Dress:
 - a. Cadets will participate in appropriate civilian dress; and
 - b. Staff will wear work dress (CADPAT/NCD).
- 17. <u>Required Materials:</u> To participate in these virtual training activities, cadets will require the following:

- a. Musical instrument and necessary accessories; and
- b. Internet access and a device capable of streaming audio at a minimum (video capabilities preferred.

OVERVIEW OF THE CENTRAL REGION VIRTUAL MUSIC PROGRAM

- 1. The program consists of four components conducted concurrently, as follows:
 - a. Asynchronous, self-lead content;
 - b. Virtual group lessons;
 - c. Instrument lessons; and
 - d. Music level evaluation.
- 2. Cadets have the option to participate in one or more of these components in any combination.

ASYNCHRONOUS, SELF-LEAD CONTENT

- 3. Cadets will be provided access to online music resources including, but not limited to, theory videos, instrumental technique videos, websites, etc. This component will enable cadets to engage, explore, and develop in aspects of the music program that appeal to them at their own pace.
- 4. There is no FORTRESS or other registration process required for cadets who want to participate in this component.

GROUP LESSONS

- 6. Cadets will participate in group music lessons at the basic, intermediate, or advanced level. Topics may include music theory, instrument maintenance, aural and rhythm skills.
- 7. The group lessons will be conducted on Saturday mornings from 0900-1200 hrs.

INSTRUMENT LESSONS

- 8. Cadets will participate in three, 45 minute private/semi-private, on-line music lessons.
- 9. Registered cadets will be assigned to a music instructor who will contact the cadet to schedule the lessons. The content of the lessons will be individually tailored by the instructor to each cadet's specific level and needs.

MUSIC PROFICIENCY LEVEL EVALUATION

- 10. All required information, music and assessment forms for cadet music proficiency levels are available on the CCO SharePoint documents library.
- 11. Prior to being formally evaluated, it is expected that cadet musicians will have been provided with the applicable music, be aware of the requirements, standards, and have had suitable instruction and practice time to prepare them for success.
