GETTING TO KNOW YOUR FELLOW MEMBERS

MAXINE TRUDEAU'S HISTORY

Maxine was born in the village of Haliburton, Ontario. At the age of 16 **Maxine** joined the RCAF 3 days after graduating High School in June 1954. She did her basic training at St. Jean, Quebec. **Maxine** noted that she had worked with **Jen Casey** (who died in May 2020 from an air accident) from the Snowbirds when she was in Belleville. **Casey's** aunt was in Basic training with **Maxine** in 1956.

While at CFB Chatham **Maxine** was a member of a local RCFA wing in March 1958. In November of 1958, while on leave, she went to her home in Haliburton. Branch #110 of

the local Legion held a special meeting so that she could be sworn in. **Maxine** was also the Public Relations representative for the Golden Hawks out of CFB Chatham during their Spring Training in 1959 and 1960.

Maxine remembers being with the **Yarnell's** during her service. She was in the Air Force with **Roy Skillicorn** and also worked with him as a civilian at Sears was with the **Tosh's** and **Hatters**. In her trade career, **Maxine** was to become one of the first two women to achieve Officer status as an Aircraft Controller. She was also part of a Precision Drill Team and was selected twice for an Honour Guard during the Queen's visits to Canada. She had transferred to Metz, France from 1962-1963.

An article from the "pic of the past' dated Tuesday, October 20, 2009 stated:

When **Maxine Trudeau** was growing up in Halliburton, she showed special athletic skills. When she discovered that the Royal Canadian Air Force had an intensive training program for athletes, she decided to make it her first career. She won medals in swimming, diving and decathlon over a three-year period. But when she wasn't training, she was enhancing her other skills and became one of the first two women to achieve officer status as an Aircraft Controller. She was also part of a precision drill team and was selected twice for an honour guard during the Queen's visits to Canada.

As a wife and mother, she travelled with her family around the world – Whitehorse, Vancouver, France, Italy and Germany before finally setting in Belleville. She was a Canadian delegate to a United Nations European conference. In her 'spare' time she was a faithful volunteer with St. Vincent de Paul.

This photo of her was taken in October 1959 at CFB St. Hubert in Quebec when **Mrs. Trudeau** was in command of a class of airwomen training on a new radar system for North America.

Mrs. **Trudeau** joined the Haliburton Legion in 1958, when there were only two other female Ordinary members from the Second World War: **Eileen Morrison** and **Sylvian Sisson**. She invites old friends and graduates of the Grade 7 / 8 class of 1948 to visit her on Facebook.

Our thanks to her for providing the photo and information. The aircraft was a "North Star" – vintage aircraft from WWII. Her Chief Operations Service Officer (COPSO), who was in charge of radar towers, was **Yarnell** (W/C), a pilot in WWII in St. Hubert, Quebec and Lac St. Denis.

In Europe, she was a Canadian delegate to the United Nations European Conference. **Maxine** was transferred to CFB Trenton from 1967-1969 after returning from Sardinia, Italy. She retired from Lahr, Germany in July 1972.

By October 1972 **Maxine** started a 25-year career with Sears, retiring as one of their managers in May of 1997. Her husband **Frank Morrel (Morrelli)** had served as the Treasurer for the City of Belleville from 1969 to 1996. Her involvement with the Society of St. Vincent de Paul had continued since the 1950s during and after her military service. As previously mentioned, **Maxine** had originally joined the Legion in Haliburton in 1958. She had joined Branch 99 of the Belleville Legion in 1995. **Maxine** had also joined the ANAF in **1962** in Sea Island, B.C. She re-joined the ANAF in Belleville in 2019.

Maxine joined 418 Wing RCAFA in the mid 80's, had a period of absence and re-joined the Wing in 1998. City Hall has been a part of her life for over 40 years. She likes to be known as the Public Relations "Girl Friday" for the City of Belleville, CFB Trenton, the Diocese and the Belleville Club. She attends many of the local Probus Meetings in the City. Elmwood Cemetery has been in **Maxine's** life for the past 20 years continuing to honour the many interred service personnel.

Since many activities are COVID dependent keep an eye on your emails for updates. Those with no email will receive a phone call. Thanks


