Cdt Ellis mentioned that the competition was very fun and a good experience where she got to meet a lot of new people. She mentioned her interest in coming out again next year to shoot. Upon trying marksmanship with her friends, she was influenced to try out for the marksmanship team. We are so proud of this team and their outstanding results!

Over the course of the training year, cadets on the effective speaking team have been working hard to write speeches for the annual competition. LAC Armstrong, Cpl Elder, and Sgt Windatt each presented great speeches at the squadron competition with Cpl Elder moving on to represent 608 at the zone competition. Cpl Elder did a great job,

placing 4th overall. She thoroughly enjoyed her experience at the competition and mentioned it was a good way to meet new people who had similar interests, people in the community such as radio hosts and listen to others' speeches.

As well as our routine training nights, WO2 Rozema-Seaton recently put together a Senior Cadet Leadership Seminar. This activity allowed senior cadets from across local units to network and learn helpful tips and tricks from one another that they can then bring back to their home unit. We saw great attendance with cadets from 608 Air, 173 Air and 79 Sea who turned out to participate. This event was hosted to help senior cadets build their leadership skills; many local female leaders were also in attendance to talk to the cadets about leadership.
